Foundation for Blind Children

\$15,000

Founded in 1952 by parents to serve the needs of their blind children, FBC is now the largest non-profit agency of its kind in the United States. With three locations across the valley, over 2000 children and 400 adults participate in programs for blind, visually impaired and multi-handicapped children. Our grant helps with early childhood therapy.

Jewish Family Children's Service

\$7,000

JFCS Real World Job Development ~ Our grant will benefit children and youth who have experienced severe trauma and abuse, as well as those with developmental disorders such as autism. Therapeutic toys and games will be purchased for use in the Dr. Irwin 'Light Play' Therapy Room. Play therapy is an important tool that enables children to freely express themselves, helping them overcome past trauma and promoting healthy development.

Aid to Adoption of Special Kids (AASK)

\$6,000

AASK is the largest agency in AZ. solely focused on finding loving and safe homes for children in foster care. Over 1,600 matches have been made. Our grant will support expenses for the Special Friends Mentoring Program.

Center for Positive Social Change (CASA)

\$6,000

CASA teaches children to recognize their emotions, and to learn compassion and self-management, resulting in impulse control and responsible decision making. CASA targets the root of bullying, abuse and violence by boosting self-awareness and competence in children. This leads to increased success in school and life.

Sojourner Center

\$5,500

Since 1977 the Sojourner Center has provided shelter and support for hundreds of abused women and children. It is one of the largest domestic violence shelters in the United States, serving more that 8,700 participants annually. It helps traumatized families begin to build new violence-free lives. Our grant creates campus space dedicated to teen participants.

The Family School

\$5000

Founded in 1993, this program serves the working poor offering pre-school, kindergarten and child-care. Open all day, year-round, the school offers support in special education, play therapy, counseling and parenting classes. Children removed from other facilities due to behavioral problems are provided intervention services. The multi-lingual staff serves a diverse population. Our funds will purchase an Outlast Block Set for their outdoor play area.
